

Book Selection

Brisbane has a rich tapestry of stories, experiences and understandings, all unique and from many different perspectives. A small part of this is captured in this catalogue of 15 books which illustrate the changing needs and drives of cultural growth. From migration historical patterns through to political developments, from the tussle over federation and the strong divide between country and city through to the Australian tradition of gambling, many stories have contributed to the Brisbane and Queensland character. In this collection, well-known Australian authors are represented in the Australian tradition of the 'yarn'. Indigenous stories illustrating the complexities of colonialism and showing a darker side of Australian cultural history, local Brisbane suburban history, the distinctive character of the Moreton Bay locale, personal journeys, family histories and educational history are all represented. The collection is in no way comprehensive; it merely scrapes the surface and many aspects of culture are not covered, such as architecture, gardens and town planning. This collection is only a very small sample of the fascinating writing and stories existing about Brisbane lives.

It is hoped that this catalogue will ignite discussion and will be shared and enjoyed by as many Queenslanders as possible.

Queensland Narrating Service (QNS)

The Queensland Narrating Service (QNS) is a non-profit organisation which produces audio format information for people with print disabilities. The print disabilities may include blindness or vision impairment, low literacy levels or a reading problem such as dyslexia, a physical disability which prevents the use of books and printed materials or a brain injury or trauma such as stroke.

Copyright exemptions are obtained on published books and volunteer narrators read the books onto cassette tape or computer. The cassettes and CDs produced by QNS have 'restricted access' and are for the use of print disabled readers only.

Brisbane's Social and Cultural History Catalogue

This catalogue for print disabled readers has been created with the generous assistance of the Brisbane City Council's Local History Grants Program 2002/03. Two copies of each title in the catalogue have been given to the Brisbane City Council's library service and the State Library of Queensland to add to their special access collections.

This catalogue differs from standard QNS catalogues in that it brings together a collection of books which are set in and are about Brisbane. It acknowledges the cultural attachment of 'the local' that binds the Brisbane community of which print disabled readers are a part. The catalogue is designed to be a resource for school students researching Brisbane and Queensland history and social sciences and to appeal to older people who have memories of early Brisbane. Local histories and stories present positive examples for people to follow, so it is hoped that this catalogue might inspire further story telling in the print disabled community.

This catalogue has been created without regard to circulation figures, but it is hoped that many people will be able to listen to one or more of these audio books which are available in CD only.

BRISBANE HISTORY BRISBANE: MORETON BAY MATTERS GROUP

This volume comprises twelve papers dealing with various aspects of Moreton Bay history, from pre-European settlement to the 1990s.

While *Moreton Bay Matters* presents a largely chronological history of this important region, it has intentionally set out to record the episodes that have either been ignored or forgotten. By so doing, this volume reveals the close links between the indigenous peoples, the convicts and missionaries, the fisherman and the whalers, the government authorities. From dugongs to whaling this marine frontier has played a significant role in Queensland's economic history. So, too, have land-based activities ranging from sugar to tourism, with the latter emphasising the growing interest in Moreton Bay's natural and historic heritage. Above all, this collection takes the reader for an intriguing ride through the legacy of Moreton Bay.

DICKINSON, AS I'VE SEEN IT Mercy

Mercy Dickinson sees life with a sharpness and clarity very few of us possess. What started out as a carefree life soon became tumultuous and filled with obstacles and frustrations. Before Mercy was eight she lost her sight to meningitis.

As I've Seen It is an inspirational story of one woman's extraordinary courage, determination and inner strength. She says, "I am one of the 'lucky ones' losing my sight when I was old enough to have seen the beauty of the world yet young enough to adapt to the loss."

During her life Mercy has achieved extraordinary successes both in Australia and overseas: she becaame the first blind student to gain a secondary school education in Queensland as well as a BA from the University of Queensland in 1940. In 1953, she won a Fullbright scholarship to the New York Institute for the Education of the Blind. She also trained as a teacher of the blind in the United States and London. As a crowning jewel in a distinguished career, Mercy received an honorary PhD from the Queensland University of Technology in 1995.

Although the challenges faced might have pushed others perilously close to surrendering, Mercy's sheer determination and will to see the job done, prevailed. This story charts her remarkable journey to equal her peers and then, in a modest and unassuming way, to surpass them. Mercy may have lost her sight, but never once, her vision.

People like Celia Smith are remembered through stories told and re-told by their family and community.

Among the many things remembered about Celia Smith's life commitment to justice and compassion, are her lobbying for Gurindji land rights in the distant north-west; walking the community with bags of food and loose coins she would give to those in need; speaking in court for a young mother on manslaughter charges; running cardgames and dances and always caring for her family.

Celia Smith left her mark on South-East Queensland communities, and there are also many others around Australia who will remember her.

This volume comprises eleven papers on the history of ethnicity and multiculturalism in the Brisbane region since the 1850s. It concentrates on the colonial period from separation to federation and the twentieth century through the two world wars until modernity.

This unique collection provides interesting and informative historical accounts of our journey from different pasts to one future as Australians.






